Council Meeting Highlights — July 18, 2017

COUNCIL CODE OF CONDUCT BYLAW

A Draft Bylaw relating to Council Code of Conduct was presented to Council for their information. This is a new requirement under the Regulations of the Modernized Municipal Government Act.

2017 STREET PROGRAM AWARDING **OF TENDER**

The Tender Bids for the 2017 Street Program closed on Thursday, July 6 at 2 p.m. Council awarded the 2017 Street Program contract to A & A Paving in the amount of \$526,139.25.

NOVEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

The November Council meeting may have a conflict due to the AUMA Convention in Calgary. Council declared the November Regular Council Meeting to be held on Tuesday, November 14, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

SHOW & SHINE ROAD CLOSURE

The 6th Annual Show & Shine hosted by the Cremona/Water Valley Chamber of Commerce is on September 9, 2017 with a rain date of September 16, 2017. Council approved the following road closures for the Show and Shine:

- Center St. from Railway Ave to 2
- 1 St. W from Railway Ave. up to and including 1 Ave. W;
- 1 Ave. W from 1 St. W to Center Street.

RESIGNATION FROM CREMONA MUNICIPAL LIBRARY BOARD

Cremona Municipal Library Board Chair, Tracy Westerson tendered her resignation effective May 25, 2017. Council thanked Ms. Westerson for her time and commitment to the Cremona Municipal Library Board and accepted her resignation as of May 25, 2017.

5 YEAR CAPITAL PLAN

Council approved a 5 Year Capital Plan from 2017 to 2022. This plan will be available on the Village's website.

INTERMUNICIPAL **COLLABORATION FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT**

One of the new requirements of the Modernized Municipal Government Act (MMGA) is that municipalities must have an Intermunicipal Collaborative Framework Agreement (ICF) in place. Council approved the Intermunicipal Collaborative Framework Agreement between Mountain View County and the Village of Cremona as presented which will come into full effect January 1, 2018.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

Council delegated to the Chief Administrative Officer the authority to work with Mountain View County Administration to decision making on the following agreements: Ag Services, Transportation and Recycling Centre.

APPOINTMENT OF ACTING CAO

The CAO will be on holidays from July 21 to August 8th. Council designated Sandi Ryan as Acting CAO from July 21 to August 8th, 2017 and is compensated in accordance with Personal Policy 1701-01 article 3.24.

LIONS RV DUMPING STATION

The RV Dumping station required repairs due to a collapse in the line. Council approved to share in the cost to repair the Lions RV Dumping Station at a cost of \$5,750 each.

- 1. Fruit and vegetable scraps
- 2. Egg shells (crushed)
- 3. Coffee grounds
- 4. Loose leaf tea
- 5. Spoiled soy/rice/almond/coconut milk
- The crumbs you sweep off of the counters and floors
- 7. Cooked pasta
- 8. Cooked rice
- 9. Stale bread, pitas, or tortillas
- 10. Stale tortilla chips or potato chips
- 11. Spoiled pasta sauce or tomato paste
- 12. Crumbs from the bottom of snack food packaging
- 13. Stale crackers
- 14. Stale cereal
- 15. Nut shells (except for walnut shells, which are toxic to plants)
- 16. Spoiled tofu and tempeh
- 17. Seaweed, kelp or nori
- 18. Un-popped, burnt popcorn kernels
- 19. Old herbs and spices
- 20. Stale pretzels
- 21. Stale candy (crushed or chopped)
- 22. Stale protein or "energy" bars
- 23. Pizza crusts
- 24. Old oatmeal
- 25. Peanut shells
- 26. Stale pumpkin, sunflower or sesame seeds (chopped up so they can't sprout)
- Avocado pits (chopped up so they don't sprout)

- 28. Moldy cheese (in moderation)
- 29. Melted ice cream (in moderation)
- 30. Old jelly, jam, or preserves
- 31. Stale beer and wine
